Bridgton's hockey program, in alignment with the Academy's Mission, aspires to develop young men into mature, independent, decision-making student-athletes who are prepared for college and beyond. The Ed Robson '50 Head Hockey Coach will be engaged across the whole campus, serving a vital role in the classroom or in an administrative position, depending on the candidate's experience.

SUMMARY OF RESPONSIBILITY AND DUTIES:

The Ed Robson '50 Head Hockey Coach is responsible for a year-round program, managing coaching staff, and game scheduling with the benefit of Chalmers Ice Arena here on our residential campus. Responsibilities also include all aspects of leading, coaching, presenting, and, in partnership with the College Counseling Office, placing student-athletes at academically, residentially, and athletically appropriate colleges and universities. The Ed Robson '50 Head Hockey Coach is a leader on campus, assisting at Academy events (Registration, Orientation, Homecoming, Reunions, Commencement, etc), with some evening and weekend responsibilities required, as demanded by a boarding school environment.

Applications for the position will be accepted immediately, with an immediate start date.

The position is full-time and features a comprehensive benefits package, with on campus housing options. A competitive salary is offered, commensurate with experience. Bridgton Academy offers a robust, competitive benefits package including medical, dental, vision, short- and long-term disability, life insurance, a very generous paid time off policy, and a retirement plan with company match.

REQUIREMENTS: At a minimum – a Bachelor's degree and 3-5 years of demonstrated college level coaching experience as well as a strong, verifiable network of New England and northeastern college and high school coaches.

- Exceptional organizational skills, including excellent computer skills
- Understanding of independent school culture, or a willingness to work toward that understanding
- Empathy, patience, tact, collegiality and energy to build on Bridgton hockey's tradition of postgraduate success.

REPORTS TO: Director of Athletics

The position works with the Academy Director of Athletics on oversight of all program management, operational, and budgetary concerns, while also collaborating with the Academy's Admissions team to annually recruit and build a team of twenty five (25) student-athletes, each of whom ideally reflects the Academy's focus on attracting high character, mission appropriate young men.
